The School of Art maintains a placement service in the Office of Academic Affairs. Job notices are collected through faculty contacts and mailings and posted in a "Job Book." Subscriptions are held to the College Art Association publications, Current Jobs in Art, Jobline, National Arts Jobbank, National Arts Placement, Sculptors International, and Society for Photographic Education Newsletter. Information on grants and fellowships is also maintained, and an annual Career Workshop for second-year students takes place each fall. The above resources are available to current students, alumni, and artists in the community.

A significant majority of School of Art alumni earn their living in the discipline in which they were trained or in a related field.
